Some Key Thesis:

- **Public-Private cooperation** gets more important under AEC
- TVET needs **to be more agile and modular** so that it can be more demand oriented in a more integrated regional market.
- Although the **European Dual TVET model** has proven to be very successful, ASEAN member states should refrain from simply copying it.
- Although isolated pockets of best practices for business participation exist, **scalability on a systemic level remains a considerable challenge.**
